





Note: A ratio of greater than 100% can occur when the U.S. is a net energy exporter or when there are net additions to stored energy.


















Well Control Rule

- GAO report added fuel to the fire









Proposed Mid and South Atlantic Lease Sale 260 (2021)









Efforts to Shut Down Seismic Work





It is still used in the U.S. waters off the Gulf of Mexico with no known detrimental impact to marine animal populations or commercial fishing."


